We are coming off of one of our best fall athletic seasons ever with two sectional titles, a regional win, volleyball setting a record for win totals, and several individual awards including Mr. Prange, our girls' soccer coach, winning the Small School Coach of the Year. This indeed has been an amazing year for our Sheridan Schools! The community support of our referendum request has been most reassuring to our superintendent, school board, and, most of all, our teachers and school staff personnel. Your school board members fully appreciate the responsibilities that you have given us. We are honored by the trust you have put in us by approving our refer-

endum and supporting our schools in so many ways. We maintain a sincere attitude of serious stewardship of our school's financial and academic health.



### **GUIDANCE NEWS**

#### **SHS Office of School Counseling Announcements:**

**New SCS Social Worker -** We are excited to welcome Mrs. Kate Lynch to our team as a social worker who will be working with students across the district and at the Northern Hamilton County Academy. Mrs. Lynch has hit the ground running and is doing a great job with our students, and we are excited to add her to our SCS Counseling team. Welcome, Mrs. Lynch!

**Schedule Change Requests -** Students who need to request a schedule change at SHS for the second semester will need to submit the required request forms no later than December 15th. Schedule changes are not guaranteed. They will be reviewed by Mr. Davis and Mrs. Cantlon.

**Employability Skills -** Seniors, your Employability Skills forms must be completed and turned in before the end of 1st semester so we can appropriately document them to the state. If you need another copy, please stop by the Office of School Counseling. As a reminder, this is the form that you must have filled out and signed by an employer, coach, club sponsor, etc.

**FAFSA REQUIRED** - All seniors are now required by the state of Indiana to file the FAFSA, regardless of their current postsecondary plans. If you choose NOT to fill it out, you will be required to formally opt out. More information to come after winter break. We will be hosting a couple of help sessions and FAFSA/Financial Aid presentations for seniors and their families in the next couple of months. On Thursday, December 7th, INvestEd will be here for a FAFSA information and FSA ID night. If you are a senior and/or a parent/guardian of a senior, I would highly recommend that you attend these evening events. The 2024-2025 FAFSA does not open up until sometime in December so we will have INvestEd return on Monday, January 8th to walk families/students through the actual FAFSA application. Please keep an eye out for information from Mrs. Cantlon about these events.

**Scholarships -** Scholarship season is upon us, and all seniors need to make sure they are checking their email for information about which scholarships are available and where they can find that information. We are working on updating our SHS website to list them on the website, but in the meantime, please continue to check your email for this information.

**Scheduling for 2024-2025 School Year -** Mrs. Cantlon will begin meeting with current members of the Class of 2028 about scheduling on Wednesday, December 6th. That evening, there will also be a parent meeting to go over high school scheduling and graduation requirement information. If you are a current 8<sup>th</sup> grade parent, please plan to attend this meeting if at all possible. You should have received an email with the date/time from Mrs. Cantlon. If you did not receive it, you will need to update your SchoolMessenger settings in your PowerSchool Parent Portal. Scheduling for students in the classes of 2025-2027 will begin after we return from Christmas break.

Volunteer Mentor Opportunities with Sheridan Students Did you know the number one resiliency factor for at-risk youth is the involvement of a caring adult? There are two ways adults can volunteer and make a difference in the life of a Sheridan student.

**Lunch PALS** is exactly that-volunteers who meet with a child during their lunch/recess time at the elementary school. This is a commitment that can be once a week or twice a month during the school year. The first step is to apply here.

**Community Mentors** are matched with an upper elementary or middle school student for a calendar year. They meet twice a month at times that work for the volunteer and student, which can be after school, evenings, or during the weekend. Group events are held once a month to provide fun and free activities for mentors and students but are not mandatory. Hello from Sheridan Athletics and YES, it is a great time to be a BLACKHAWK!

I want to take a moment to recap our outstanding fall season of 2023-2024. This fall, 150 student-athletes participated in seven sports including football, volleyball, soccer, cross country, and girls' golf. Sheridan's student-athletes excelled both in the classroom and on the playing field.

Volleyball had a record-breaking season, winning 15 games before losing to the eventual Sectional Champion Cascade.

Girls' Soccer made history by winning their first-ever Sectional Championship and also won their first IHSAA Regional Semi-final game, moving them into the Elite 8. Although they lost to eventual State Runner-up, Ft. Wayne Luers, Senior Emma Alexander garnered several awards, including Defensive MVP, HHC All-Conference, Paul Logan Award, ICGS Academic All-State, ISCA Academic All-State, and ISCA All District 1st Team.


Boys' Soccer had a good season despite a very tough schedule.

### Sheridan High School Highlights

It has been a terrific first semester for Sheridan High School! We continue to collect exemplary reports from IHSAA officials (6 as of 11/28) and have several student-athletes who have been recognized as all-conference and Academic All-state. Mrs. Waitt was recognized and celebrated by the Indiana Department of Education with the Digital Innovator Excellence Award, and Mrs. Williams has been selected as a NEA Foundation Global Learning Fellowship. Three of our students were honored by the College Board with the National Rural and Small School Award for their academic excellence. Our work-based learning programs continue to grow and students are getting unique experiences in a variety of ways. It is apparent that good, no, great things are happening at Sheridan High School!

As we excitedly roll into the holiday season, we are looking forward to the holiday concerts and events, basketball, and wrestling. We also are deep into planning for the 2024-2025 school year as we look at curricular offerings and will soon begin scheduling. We look forward to the completion of construction and the opportunities and resources the new facilities will provide. We are happy you are along for the ride with us as we continually work to provide an excellent and outstanding education and high school experience for the students of Sheridan High School.

#### Sheridan High School -Early College

Sheridan High School has had the honor and privilege to be a part of the Rural Early College Network Grant (RECN) for the past two and a half years. This grant, aimed at helping schools develop an Early College Program, has provided information, support, and funding to help initiate and build the Sheridan High School – Early College. The primary purpose of an Early College program is to provide the opportunity, structure, and support for students to earn college credits while in high school. The Sheridan High School – Early College (SHS-EC) focuses on the "3-E's" where we want all of our graduating seniors to be: Enrolled, Employed, or Enlisted as they graduate from high school. While the name "early college" reflects the foundational goal of earning college credits in high school, we recognize that encouraging students to push themselves academically to pursue dual credits while in high school will provide great advantages for our graduates no matter what they pursue after high school. Additionally, earning college credits in high school is a tremendous money savings opportunity for students and parents. This year, SHS students taking dual credit classes are estimated to save over \$51,000 in tuition costs.

As a component of the SHS-EC, students are now able to earn what is called the Indiana College Core (ICC). The ICC is a program that allows students to "Start as a Sophomore" when they go to college. It requires students to earn at least three credit hours in six competency areas, as well as an additional 12 "elective" credit hours from those same categories. These courses are guaranteed to transfer to any public Indiana college or university after graduation. These six competencies include Written Communication, Speaking and Listening, Quantitative Reasoning, Scientific Ways of Knowing, Social & Behavioral Ways of Knowing, and Humanistic & Artistic Ways of Knowing. Students at Sheridan High School can earn these credits through Advanced Placement and Dual Credit courses offered through the high school and through our partnership with Ivy Tech.
