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## MINUTES

### **Regular Board Meeting of the Sheridan Community Schools**

#### **Board of School Trustees**

**February 13, 2023 at 6:30 PM**

The Sheridan Community Schools Board of School Trustees met for a Regular February Board Meeting on Monday, February 13, 2023 at 6:30 PM in the Sheridan Middle School Media Center with board members John Hunt, Nancy Boone, Tyler Henning and Kim Zachery present, along with Superintendent Dr. Dave Mundy.

#### **5. Sheridan Showcase**

The February Sheridan Showcase was Sheridan Elementary School. They showcased the following individuals/groups:

- Mrs. Lego, the Response to Intervention (RTI) Specialist for SES, introduced the Indiana Dyslexia Initiative and the Orton Gillingham Method. She explained that RTI helps students to be better readers and be better at math. She discussed the small groups that she works with on a daily basis and that the multi-sensory method she uses is good for children at all learning stages and not just those struggling in reading and math.
  
- Mrs. Dunphy, the high ability teacher and STEM teacher, presented two different groups she works with. As the high ability teacher she oversees a program called SOAR. She works with the students that are ranked in the top 10% of their grade. She will pull the students out of class for small amounts of the day and work on special projects and activities. Kason Cramer presented to the board a game that he created using coding techniques where tennis balls are shot at different targets.

Mrs. Dunphy also works with students in the Robotics Club, an afterschool program that is grant funded. Victoria Shinault, Casey Southerland and Waylon Hoffman presented the robots that they had created. The students are given kits filled with different robotic parts. They have to work together to build the robot's structure and then use a coding program to teach the robot to perform different tasks such as, picking an item up and then carrying and dropping it in a designated spot.

To finish the showcase Gertrude Bush, Dakota Barrick, Victoria Schnault and June Harle presented to the School Board a slideshow of several facts about why Sheridan Elementary School is the best school.
