April 2024 COUNSELOR'S CORNER

Teaching Kids How to use Money Wisely

Managing money wisely is an important life skill, and the earlier you start teaching your little entrepreneur some dollar sense, the better they will be down the road. The easiest way to teach children how to manage money wisely is through the save, spend, and give method.

Whether you allowance on certain extra chores completed, or a weekly set allowance, gather 3 jars or boxes per child. Label the three jars: save, spend, and give respectively. The rules typically are that you can take Spending money and put it either in Giving or Saving, you cannot move Saving or Giving money. Find what works best for your family. Sometimes, the traditional 10% Giving, 60% Savings, 30% Spending works. Other times, during a certain season, more money must be used for Savings rather than Spending.

Save. The savings jar is for money to be used for large purchases, or to go into a savings account for future use – such as a bicycle, or a big trip. Money in this jar goes towards the large purchase, or a real bank account.

Spend. Spending money can be used however the child wants – such as candies, movie tickets, trips to the Dollar store, vacation souvenir extras, or other "fun" things.

Give. Teaching giving to others is important even at a young age. Giving can include birthday or Christmas presents, sponsoring a child, school fundraisers, or tithing at church.

These guidelines help your child visualize how money is spent in a very real way. Help your child by letting him or her make mistakes in their money choices, and then feel the consequence of that choice. They will learn more by feeling it, than you warning them off of it!

MESSAGE FROM OUR NURSE

Lots of students are reporting dry chapped lips.

This is not healed or soothe with one application of a product.

Please send a tube or stick of lip product with your child to keep at their desk or in their back pack if needed.

Please inform the school if your cell or home phone number has changed; it is very important that we are able to reach a student's parent/guardian if needed.

The weather seems to be constantly changing right now, please make sure your children are prepared. Kids need coats, hats and gloves when it is cold and appropriate jackets for warmer days, as well as gym shoes for PE days.

If your child has needed a clothing change recently please return the borrowed clothing as soon as possible. Donations of elastic or draw string shorts / pants and slip on shoes (crocs or flip flops) are always welcome.

Attention Parents of 5th Grade Students:

State Law requires that all 6th grade student have the below listed vaccines prior to the start of the next school year. Please discuss this with your health care provider as soon as possible. Delay of this could lead to your child not being able attend school next August.

- * Tdap (Diptheria, tetanus, pertussiss)-1 dose
- * MCV4 (meningococcal conjugate)- 1 dose
- * Varicella (chicken pox) vaccines- 2 doses
- * Hepatitis A -2 doses

Head lice is always a concern please continue to check your child's head on a regular basis. Please inform me or your child's teacher if lice is found so, we can check any other suspected children here at school.

Exclusion Orders- (Children should remain home for any of the conditions listed below).

- Temp. greater than 100.0, not to return until 24 hours after fever has ended without the use of Tylenol or Motrin.
- Conjunctivitis if considered contagious
- Viral eye infection until treatment has begun, and not draining or weeping any further.
- Impetigo until treatment begins
- Scabies until treated
- If live bugs are found the student will be sent home.

If a child is found to have nits and the nits are ¼-1/2 inches from the scalp the student will not be sent home.

but the parents will be notified and responsible for removing the nits.

Vomiting or diarrhea with or without fever for 24 hours,

(Children who are vomiting/or have diarrhea need to remain home until these symptoms have stopped, and 24 hours have past)

- Ringworm until treatment begins
- Undiagnosed rash if fever is present
- Chicken pox-exclusion until cleared by Dr.
- A positive culture for Strep-until 24 hours of appropriate treatment and without fever.

Continue to return any follow up information regarding vision and hearing referrals and I will update your child's health file.







Sheridan Community Schools Volunteer/Visitor Process

Sheridan Community Schools will now be requiring all volunteers and visitors to have a background check through Safe Visitor Solutions which will include an Arrest Alert.

Arrest Alert

If a volunteer is arrested at any point after their background check has been submitted, an alert will be immediately marked in the SafeVisitor Portal and the volunteer's status will be switched from Approved to Pending and the individual will not be permitted to volunteer/visit until an investigation is concluded.

Cost

The cost of the background check is currently \$15.95, however the cost of the arrest alert will be going up starting September 1, 2023. The base cost for a background check will now be \$32.45 beginning September 1, 2023. This raise in cost is through the background check company and not due to a decision made by Sheridan Community schools.

Background checks need to be submitted at least two weeks prior to visiting the school/event. There is a possibility that additional funds will be required for the background check as some counties throughout the United States require fees for court records. SafeVisitor Solutions will email you asking for the additional funds if necessary. The cost may vary from \$1 to \$99 per county. To pay the additional funds or to ask for additional information, you can call SafeVisitor Solutions toll-free number for assistance at (888)-215-8296.

VOLUNTEER/VISITOR STATUS DETERMINATION

- No felony convictions
- No battery convictions
- No sexual offenses
- No crimes against children
- No misdemeanor convictions in the past 5 years
- 2 or more DUIs or alcohol related charges within the last 5 years
- No pending cases for disqualifying felony or misdemeanors
- No open warrants or arrests with pending adjudication

If a volunteer is not permitted to volunteer in our schools due to pending charges, at the time the pending charges are resolved, the volunteer's status will be re-evaluated.

A status determination appeal may be filed with the Superintendent's Office. A committee will examine the report and the initial determination and make final recommendations to the Superintendent concerning the volunteer's status.
