Apprenticeships

Registered Apprenticeship

Registered Apprenticeship is an industry-driven, high-quality career pathway where employers can develop and prepare their future workforce, and individuals can obtain paid work experience, receive progressive wage increases, classroom instruction, and a portable, nationally-recognized credential. Registered Apprenticeships are industry-vetted and approved and validated by the U.S. Department of Labor or a State Apprenticeship Agency.

Ivy Tech Community College and Vincennes University have programs for individuals completing an apprenticeship to also complete an Associate Degree.

Youth Apprenticeship

Apprenticeship programs for youth between the ages of 16-24 combine academic and technical classroom instruction with work experience through an apprenticeship program. It provides the foundation for youth to choose among multiple pathways – to enroll in college, begin full-time employment, or a combination.

My Next Move - O*NET Interest Profiler

- Occupational Information Network
- Classifies areas of interest into six categories w/ corresponding careers

2. <u>Holland Code Career Test</u>

 The Holland Codes is a system to classify jobs into job categories, interest clusters, or work personality environments

3. <u>Indiana Career Explorer</u>

- Quickly see how your passions and skills match with available careers- then build your resume, check out education and training resources and plan your next step.
